

In 2024, OU Health launched its Community Volunteer Program to encourage and support employees by dedicating their time and skills to charitable causes and community initiatives. This program fosters a sense of purpose, engagement, and satisfaction among employees while also impacting the broader community.















# **COMMUNITY HEALTH NEEDS ASSESSMENT (CHNA) & COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPLEMENTATION PLAN (CHIP)**

OU Health is a proud member of the Central Oklahoma Health Impact Team (COHIT). In collaboration with COHIT and our partners, OU Health conducts the Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) and Community Health Implementation Plan (CHIP). The CHNA identifies health priorities, leading to a CHIP that outlines collaborative actions to address these issues.





Behavioral Health Center - Oklahoma Children's Hospital OU Health Behavioral Health Center will provide a comprehensive and re-imagined approach to mental healthcare for children and adolescents. This facility, expected to open in winter 2026, is designed with a focus on patient safety, family-centered care, and stress reduction.

OKCPS Stay Well in School Program - The OU Health digital health program, in partnership with Oklahoma Children's Hospital, provides virtual medical care for students at school. Assisted by school nurses, students can receive diagnoses and treatments for minor illnesses and chronic conditions from OU Health pediatricians. This initiative increases healthcare access, reduces student absences, and leverages a collaboration with the OU Health outpatient pharmacy to support students' health needs.

Summer Food Program - Oklahoma Children's Hospital OU Health participates in the USDA Summer Food Service Program, offering free breakfast and lunch to children aged 18 and younger during the summer break. The meals are provided weekdays in the hospital cafeteria and aim to improve children's overall health and well-being.

During the summer of 2025, the program served a total of 1,742 meals: 779 in June, 759 in July, and 204 in August. The program ran only until August 11, as school starts on August 12.


