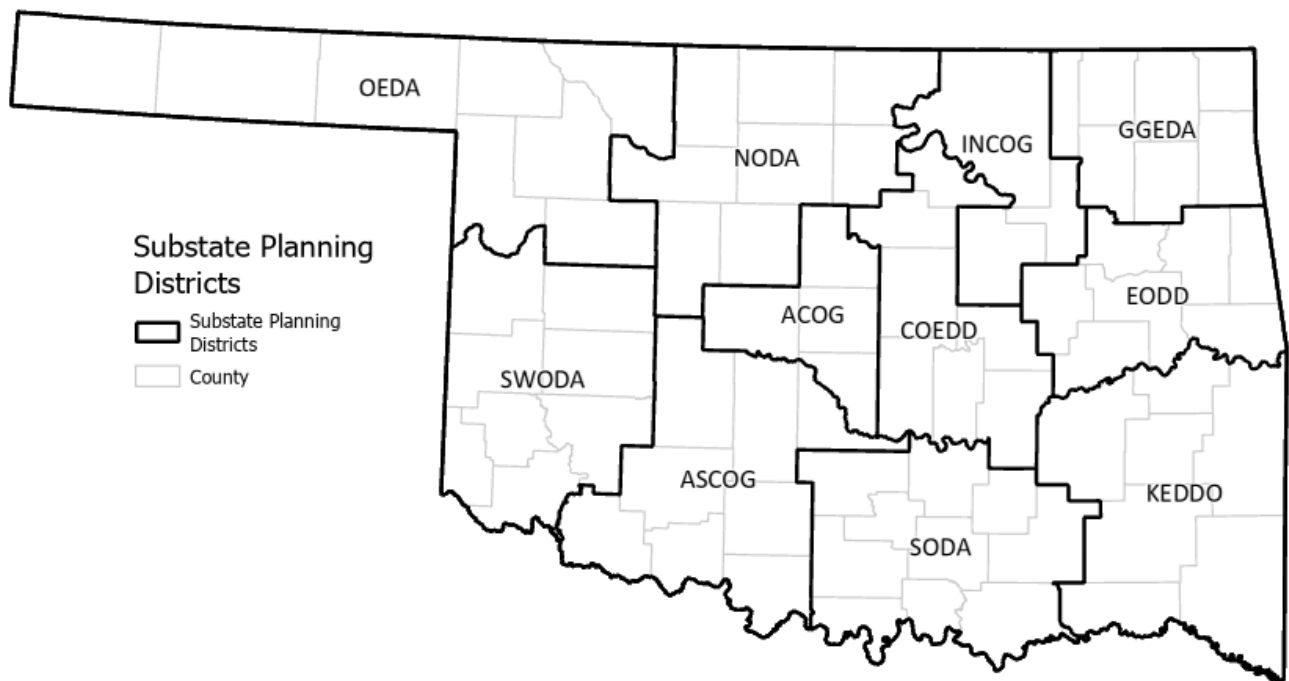


## Appendix 1: Oropharyngeal Cancer in Oklahoma

Substate planning districts (SSPD) were used for geographic representation. SSPDs are voluntary associations of local governments formed under Oklahoma law that address problems and planning needs that transcend the boundaries of individual local governments, such as counties, cities, and towns.
