WHO WE ARE

Community Living, Aging & Protective Services (CAP) provides:

- leadership by fostering strong relationships with community partners to support independence of vulnerable adults;
- protect their quality of life; and
- promote person-centered planning and delivery of services across the lifespan.







AIDS/HIV COORDINATION & INFORMATION SERVICES

Provides comprehensive case management and information to individuals diagnosed with HIV/AIDS and their families, as well as assessments, advocacy, access to community resources and follow-up services. Assists functionally impaired adults generally age 60 and over with community-based care that allows them to remain in their homes

STATE FUNDED ADULT DAY SERVICES



ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES (APS)

Investigates allegations of abuse, neglect or exploitation of vulnerable adults over age 18 in private residential settings and long-term care facilities, and helps connect vulnerable adults to the services they need to stay safely in their homes and community whenever possible.

Provides training to low-income, unemployed older adults age 55+ through a community and work-based program.




OLDER AMERICANS ACT PROGRAMS

Offers free services to Oklahomans 60 years or older to help maintain their dignity and independence. The Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) network reviews the person's needs and offers services to meet those needs. The services are offered to assist older Oklahomans to avoid being placed in a long term care facility and to live independently in their own homes. Planning and Service Areas







Assists people of all ages with their living activities at home for those who qualify financially and medically under Medicaid services. Provides services which allow Medicaid eligible persons who meet nursing facility level of care to remain at home, or in the residential setting of their choosing, while receiving necessary care.



ADVANTAGE SERVICES



MEDICARE AND MEDICINES (MIPPA)

Assists individuals that meet the program's income and resource eligibility requirements by lowering their Medicare prescription drug costs, deductibles, and premiums and provides information on preventive health services.

Allows family caregivers across the lifespan temporary relief of their responsibilities to help reduce caregiver burnout and premature institutionalization of their loved ones.

LEGAL SERVICES INFORMATION

Offers consultation, technical assistance, information and referral, and training pursuant to Oklahoma law and the older **Americans act, on legal issues** related to vulnerable adults, older Oklahomans and those who advocate for them.

LONG-TERM CARE **OMBUDSMAN**

Investigates complaints on behalf of long-term care residents with the goal of improving quality of life and quality of care. Serves residents in Oklahoma's longterm care facilities including nursing homes, assisted living and similar adult care homes.

Informs agencies and entities on the public, state, and federal level of the needs, concerns and issues of vulnerable and older Oklahomans.



Oklahoma Caregiver Coalition

Improves the supports and experiences over the lifespan of caregivers through education, advocacy, and access to resources.
