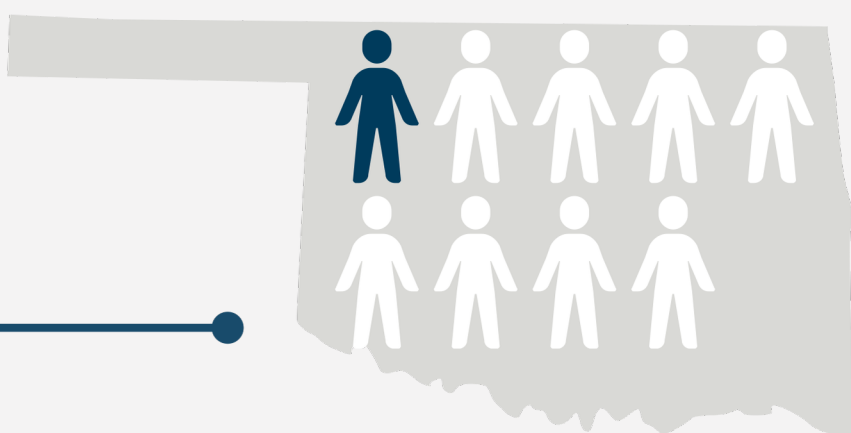




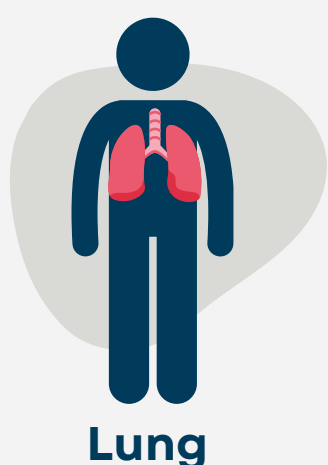

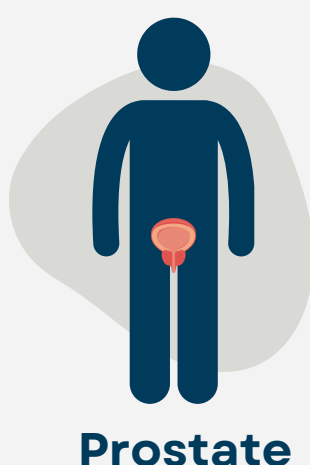
Top 4 Cancers among *Hispanic Oklahomans*



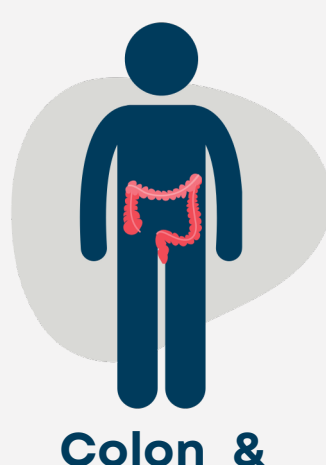
Lung

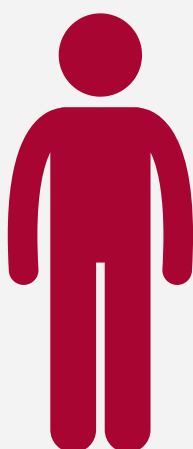

New Cancers



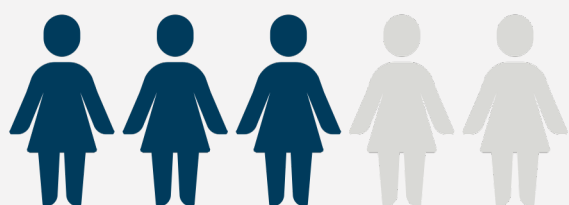
Cancer Deaths

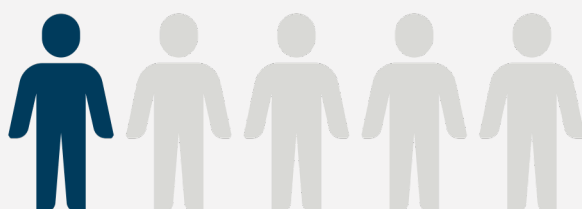
Hispanic Oklahoman Screening Rates

Men



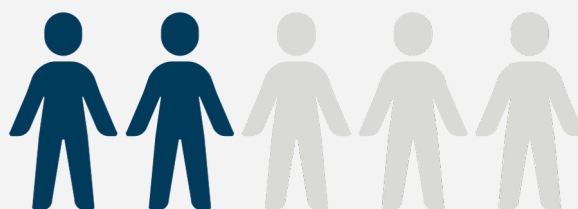
Less than **1 out of 5** men

Women



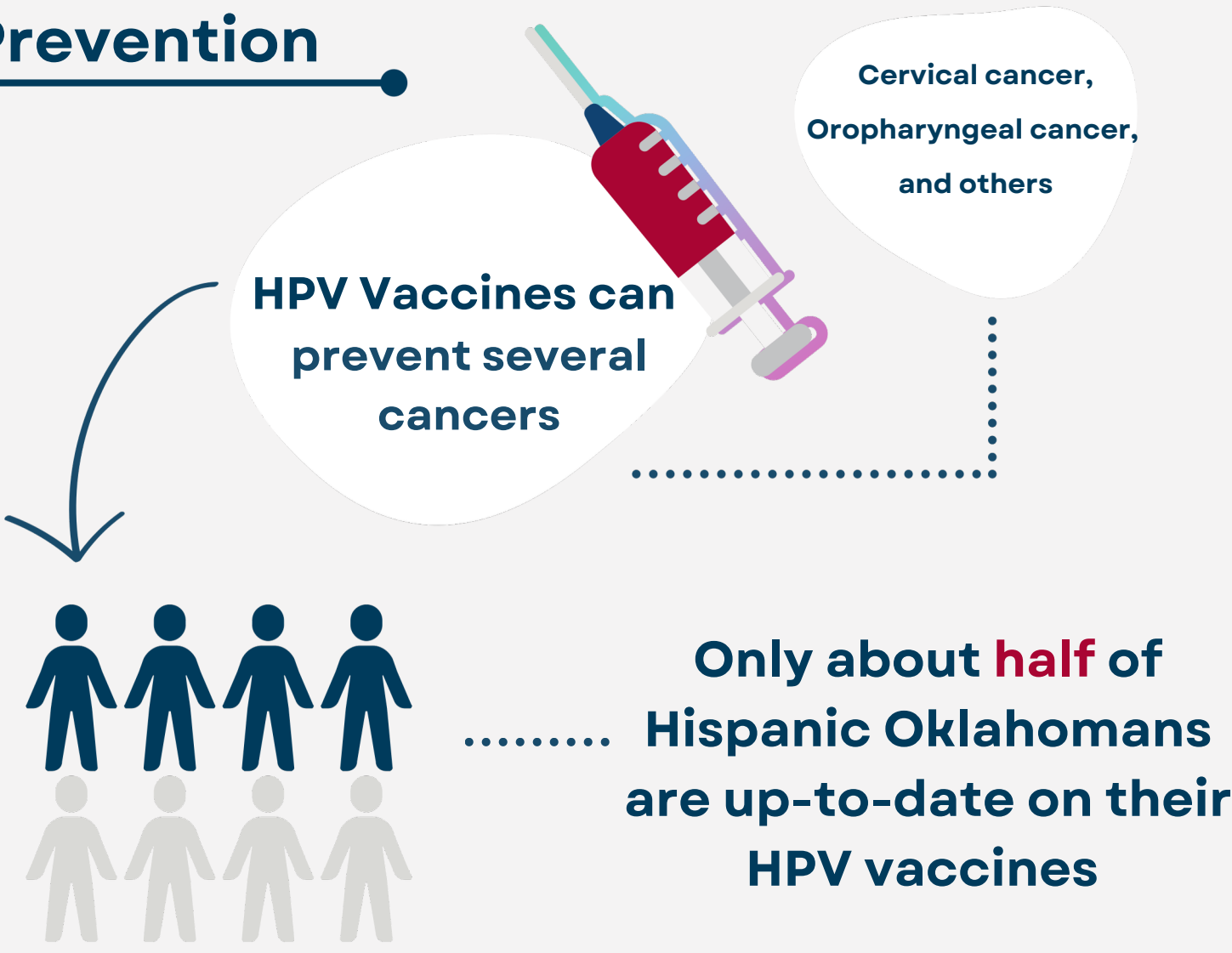
Less than **3 out of 4**

Prevention



What Can We Do?

Increase Cancer Screening

Increase program funding to increase early detection of cancer and increase survival

Improve HPV Vaccination

Increasing rates of HPV vaccination will reduce the risk for associated cancers and save lives

Awareness of Signs and Symptoms

Being aware of cancer signs and symptoms and seeking prompt health care can save lives

Improve Cancer Treatment

Consider clinical trials if diagnosed to improve treatment for high quality cancer treatment options
