OU Health is **Oklahoma's leader in Level 1 Trauma.** The Trauma Intensive Care Unit (TICU) is a 19-bed unit that sees a variety of trauma patients. Nurses in the TICU care for patients on ventilators, titrating medication drips, and managing various ortho and neuro devices. The TICU is a fast-paced environment that requires critical thinking and adaptability.

The Orthopedics/Trauma Unit is a 52-bed unit with nine stepdown beds. We provide care to recently transferred TICU patients, as well as admits from the Trauma ED, PACU, and elective orthopedic cases to include Knees, Hips, Shoulder joint replacements, along with single system orthopedic elective surgeries. The unit is a fast-paced environment that requires critical thinking, timemanagement, and teamwork. We work collaboratively with RN's, LPNs, and techs to provide the highest level of care to our patients.

- Orthopedic surgeries (Hip/Knee Replacements, Spine surgery, Amputations, Joint infections)
- Motor Vehicle/ Motorcycle Collisions
