We have compiled a quick guide to assist you in determining whether your patient requires urgent vs. routine appointment or evaluation.

Urgent Diagnoses / problems

- · Newly diagnosed diabetes
- Hyperthyroidism / Graves disease
- Diabetes insipidus
- Thyroid cancer
- Pituitary tumor
- · Adrenal insufficiency or mass
- Pheochromocytoma
- Abnormal newborn thyroid or CAH screen
- · Prepubertal vaginal bleeding in a girl or precocious puberty in a boy
- Ambiguous genitalia

Non-urgent diagnoses

- · Short stature, poor growth
- Failure to thrive (refer also to dietitian)
- Delayed or precocious puberty
- Premature adrenarche
- Hypothyroidism/ Hashimoto's Thyroiditis
- Calcium dysregulation (hyper/hypo or abnormal PTH or diminished bone mineral density)
- Undescended testes
- Cushing syndrome
- Diabetes Type 1 or 2 previously diagnosed- stable
- PCOS or irregular menstrual cycles (also refer to dietitian)
- Tall stature

PLEASE INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION WITH YOUR REFERRAL SO THAT WE CAN SCHEDULE AN APPOINTMENT FOR YOUR PATIENT-

- ✓ Most recent office note or hospital discharge summary
- ✓ Copy of all labs and radiology reports
- ✓ Growth chart
- ✓ Instruct patient to bring bone age disk or film (not a report) to their appointment for all growth and puberty diagnoses
